

A PREVIEW OF NUOSU GRAMMAR

Gerner, Matthias (2013). Grammar of Nuosu, a language of China. Berlin: Mouton (650 pages).

ABSTRACT. In this talk I present an overview of the typologically rare features of Nuosu, the most important Yi language which is spoken in Sichuan, China.

Phonology: The syllable structure in Nuosu is simple. Syllables exhibit an open structure: C(C)V. Nuosu has a rare four-way contrast "prenasalized – voiced – voiceless – aspirated" for all major points of articulation.

Morphology: Nuosu exhibits a strong synesthetic sound symbolism (Waugh, 1992, 1994). For a closed set of gradual antonym pairs, prefixing i- to an adjectival root produces the diminutive member, whereas prefixing a- to the same root yields the augmentative member of that pair.

Bare classifiers function as indefinite articles; definite articles are derived from classifiers with the nominalizer - *su*.

Syntax: Nuosu exhibits an aspect-conditioned word order split for simple clauses: SOV order in 'on-going' (\approx imperfective) clauses and OSV in 'resultative' (\approx perfective) clauses.

Pragmatics: Nuosu uses two modal particles that express the wishes and fears of the speaker through a socialized agent. The wish particle is reminiscent of the optative mood conjugation in Ancient Greek, while the fear particle is cross-linguistically unmatched. Both particles are analyzed in Gerner (2010).
